A Letter From the CEO

In this season, I have been reflecting on all that God has placed in our hands to achieve the vision that He gave to this ministry through our founder, Dr. John Edmund Haggai, over 55 years ago:

Every nation redeemed and transformed through the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

It is clear to me that God has positioned us to fulfill this vision, significantly expanding the scope and scale of Kingdom impact across the globe.

Over the years, with your partnership, God has enabled Haggai International to develop a vast infrastructure that moves us toward the vision of every nation redeemed and transformed with the Gospel of Jesus Christ, with the foundation being a transformational equipping process, now called the Haggai Leader Experience (HLE).

The objective of the HLE is to equip and inspire strategically positioned leaders to more effectively demonstrate and present the Gospel of Jesus Christ. The first session was held in 1969, and conducted in English, but soon expanded to include Arabic and Mandarin sessions in two of the most difficult-to-reach areas in the world.

In these early years of the ministry, leaders equipped by Haggai International began to express a desire to conduct the same type of equipping session in their native languages. Thus, the National Ministry model was developed, with its first session held in Thailand in 1975 — just six years after Haggai's inception. Now, there are 504 National Ministry organizations in 117 nations tasked with equipping Haggai leaders to see every nation redeemed and transformed.

In 2020, God prepared the way for us to continue equipping leaders through the development of our Virtual Haggai Leader Experience (VHLE). When the nations were shut down by the pandemic, we were able to host strategically placed leaders on our highly interactive virtual platform.

We returned to in-person equipping in 2023, with the VHLE continuing in English for those who simply preferred a virtual experience or could not attend an in-person session for various reasons.

We are rejoicing that the results of this year's equipping surpass all previous years' results both in the number of leaders and the number of nations represented.

952 leaders were equipped in English, Arabic, and Mandarin in our international sessions.

6,773 leaders were **equipped in their own languages** by our National Ministry organizations.

A total of **7,725 leaders from 117 countries and territories** were equipped by Haggai International.

Your prayers, your gifts, and your support for these leaders made this banner year possible. In terms of numbers, our five-year longitudinal data tells us that each of the **561** leaders equipped in English through the International HLE will, in the next five years, make **1,200** Gospel presentations and equip **301** others in their own nations with the skills they have learned. That will result in:

673,200 Gospel presentations with 22% of these individuals saying YES to Jesus.

168,861 others will be equipped to reach their nations with the Gospel.

In tandem with Gospel proclamation, we believe that God's love is seen and experienced through Haggai leaders...

- When the hungry are fed and the orphan adopted,
- When justice is principled and cause is championed,
- When loneliness is comforted and brokenness is healed,
- And, when people experience Jesus and His power in their own lives.

We call this "holistic witness." Defined, it is our full biblical witness to the Gospel of Jesus Christ and His Kingdom that includes our words, way of life, and work in the world. Holistic witness is always invitational, inviting others to receive and join in God's saving and renewing work.

As you read the stories in this State of the Ministry Report, you will see the impact of your Haggai leaders' holistic witness across the world. I pray you will be blessed!

While we rejoice in the numbers equipped and the individuals, communities, and nations impacted, we know there is much left to do to see His Kingdom come and will be done "on Earth as it is in Heaven."

In Luke 11, Jesus teaches us to pray for God's Kingdom to come, and then in Luke 12 I find one of my favorite parables. The initial verse (Luke 12:35) tells us to, "be dressed ready for service and keep your lamps burning." But the parable's final verse is the one that has found its way deep into my soul: "From everyone who has been given much, much will be demanded; and from the one who has been entrusted with much, much more will be asked."

God has placed much in our hands to steward for the cause of the Kingdom! While the beginnings of Haggai International were small, God's provision and the faith and determination of Dr. Haggai and the giants on whose shoulders we stand — has led to a vast network of leaders across the globe, along with a significant infrastructure to continue equipping leaders to advance the end of Gospel poverty.

Co-laboring with you, and in partnership with our leaders, we diligently pursue sending more laborers in to the harvest. May we faithfully persist in praying as Jesus taught us to pray: "Thy Kingdom come, thy will be done on Earth as it is in Heaven."








HAGGAI LEADERS SHARE THEIR STORIES

Three Haggai leaders joined more than 200 guests in Texas for an event that included dinner, live music, and impactful conversations.

Dr. Robert Wafula from Kenya, Silvana Mercado from Argentina, and Dr. Lorraine Francis from India shared powerful stories of God's work in the lives of people once Gospel poor. Those in attendance also heard a confidential report from one of our leaders working in the Middle East.

HAGGAI GLOBAL ADVISORY COUNCIL MEETING IN DUBAI

The Haggai Global Advisory Council (HGAC) exists to walk alongside national ministries as they celebrate God's work through their ministries. It helps them renew their commitment to Haggai's mission and vision and discern nationwide practices for contextualized implementation that align with the Haggai Strategic Plan.

This year, the HGAC's meeting in Dubai, United Arab Emirates, brought together 151 Haggai leaders from 71 countries. Their theme was "Every Nation."

The council acknowledged that ending Gospel poverty is more urgent and demanding than ever before. Therefore, they pledged:

- To remain committed, before God and alongside fellow Haggai leaders, to the mandate of Jesus Christ with renewed zeal and strategic planning (Matthew 28:18-20, Mark 16:15, and Luke 24:47).
- To live dedicated and exemplary lives as effective witnesses of Jesus Christ in all spheres of influence, especially the marketplace (1 Peter 1:15-16, Hebrews 12:14, 2 Corinthians 5:20, and 2 Timothy 4:5).

MONGOLIA PILOT

The goal of Haggai International has always been to accelerate the end of Gospel poverty.

Toward this vision, prioritizing the most Gospel poor nations, our leadership team piloted the Accelerate Ending Gospel Poverty Initiative in Mongolia. This pilot — led by local Haggai leaders — focused on unifying the existing Church to reach every Mongolian province with the Good News of Jesus Christ.

The result?

We collaborated with 49 like-minded organizations and facilitated 256 meetings with 1,146 local leaders. The Gospel was shared with 33,211 Mongolians, leading to 4,431 souls accepting Christ. 28,000 Bibles were distributed to those who had never encountered it before.

This is Heaven coming to Earth: when believers are unified to be the hands and feet of Jesus, bringing the Good News to every nation. Christlike unity accelerates the end of Gospel poverty!

Return to In-Person Equipping

T stepped off the plane, rushed through immigration and customs, I grabbed the shuttle, and arrived at the venue. It was June 2023, my first in-person Haggai Leader Experience (HLE) since the pandemic. I have been at three HLEs since then and am preparing for another in May. We were a little rusty, having not run an inperson session for over three years, but the great memories and the importance of ending Gospel poverty fueled our return.

Did it work? Yes, and it continues to! The facilitators, the whole of the equipping team, and the metrics run with session participants have confirmed it. God has done it again! We now have successful virtual and in-person HLE programs - and an enhanced two-week program — to expand and accelerate the work of equipping leaders to demonstrate and proclaim the Gospel, equipping others to do the same effectively.

Will we ever stop virtual sessions after returning to in-person gatherings? No, and for two important reasons: Many leaders busy in their marketplaces and ministries cannot come to an in-person session, and many others are unable to leave their countries for sociopolitical reasons. The option of attending their HLE virtually has been and continues to be an answer to prayer.

Launching Global Insight

A tour Fall 2023 Haggai Global Advisory Council meeting in Dubai, Thought Leadership was formally launched within our worldwide network under the name: *Global Insight*.

This name signals that our global network will be the thought leaders keeping us on the leading edge of God's global mission. Our role is to gather our leaders, surface their insights and innovations, and create resources based on their experiences that drive our network deeper into faithful ministry on Kingdom frontiers.

At the Dubai gathering, we surveyed our leaders about the top three realities impacting Gospel witness, and their responses were, in order: 1) a widening generational gap in Church and society, 2) digital technology, and 3) migration.

In response, we hosted a virtual NextGen forum for our top young leaders and those equipping them this spring. In June, we launched our first-ever virtual Global Insight Forum to bring together our most pioneering Haggai leaders to learn how they live a holistic Gospel witness.

What we learn together at these events will be synthesized into e-books geared toward Kingdom leaders in and beyond Haggai. We are also actively preparing for our first in-person Global Insight Forum in 2025.

These initiatives will undoubtedly unite us as an organization and align us more deeply with the Holy Spirit's guidance as we seek to end Gospel poverty.



▲ t our annual Ending Gospel Poverty Weekend Ain Atlanta, we celebrated the stories of leaders reaching their communities — often their entire countries — in transformative ways. These stories challenged us to come together in pursuit of a world free from Gospel poverty.

At our Friday Forum, partners gathered to hear about the groundbreaking pilot program in Mongolia directly from its leaders. They also participated in a Q&A with Haggai's Executive Director of Middle East Ministries, receiving an in-depth look at our work in one of the most dangerous regions of the world for followers of Jesus.

The festivities culminated in Saturday night's Gala. More than 350 partners gathered in Atlanta's Coca-Cola Roxy Theater. They heard stories of transformative mentorship in Uganda, exponential church growth across rural India, and the rescue of human trafficking survivors in Mexico from faithful Haggai leaders. Against the backdrop of these impactful Gospel stories, we saw glimpses of God answering a prayer we all know and love ... bringing His Kingdom to Earth as it is in Heaven.

God Visits a Middle Eastern Mother's Dream

"It is not impossible for a Muslim to accept Christ as Lord." — Benjamin*, Egyptian Haggai leader While serving a community of families in the Middle East, Benjamin* and a few members from his ministry knocked on one family's door to see how they could provide for any need they had, from food to local resources. The family's mother opened the door, but instead of a polite greeting, Benjamin saw shock come over her face.

Benjamin and his team quickly assured her that the purpose of their visit was in peace - salam.

She urgently ushered them in, shaking her head: "No, no, I must tell you. This morning I dreamed that I received guests, and their greeting to me was 'peace, peace be upon you."

After a pause, while they all looked at each other, the woman asked Benjamin and his ministry partners, "Are you Christians?" When they replied yes, everyone felt a mysterious Peace fill their hearts and the room.

This moment impacted not only this mother, who heard the Gospel that day, but also the leaders Benjamin brought with him to equip them in sharing this hope. They came away in awe when they saw how powerfully God was preparing people to hear the Good News, if only they would be faithful to knock on the door.

Please pray for Benjamin as he's begun a new online ministry that teaches and equips others in Arabic.

The Power of One

ne villager at a time. One village at a time. This is the philosophy that Haggai leader Sedera Voahary demonstrates in his everyday ministry, each day of the year.

Combining evangelism with medical expertise, Sedera and his team gain the trust and confidence of the people they treat. And thus, gaining the people's attention as they see love in action.

In a remote village in Madagascar, called Ambavala, Sedera and his team have reached these people through a young teenager named Flangi. For 10 years, Flangi had lived with large tumors in his mouth. Sedera met him two years ago, when they helped him receive treatment at a larger, capital city. At one point, he even went to Korea for further surgery.

Sedera shares, "Following his recovery, Flangi returned and made a big impact on his village. His entire family dedicated their lives to Jesus. Many people in the village were simply amazed and did not even recognize him. And because of that family of four, another village near theirs is now open to hearing the message of the Gospel."

Now that Sedera and his team at Jesus Family Kingdom have reached the village of Ambavala and the one next to it, they will begin to disciple villagers in the ways of Jesus through months-long trainings. Sedera's team built a school in the village and is training teachers to provide a Christian education for the students. Before school starts each morning, they share a devotion and teach the children about the love of Christ. Sedera is also starting a fishing business to fund the teachers' salaries and build a church so that the Good News of Jesus will be accessible, eventually planting a church so new Christians can gather together.

This is repeated with each village they gain access to through providing medical help, namely consultations and teeth extraction. Each month, the team goes by helicopter to a place where there is no church in the village. Sedera describes, "The places our team goes to are usually very difficult to reach, consist of traditions of idol worship, and the people usually cannot read or write."

In another village, Paradisakely, a school was built and families were transformed through its influence. "One of them is Julien," Sedera shares, "He was an abusive alcoholic and didn't seem to care for his family. After he received Christ, he changed inside. He became free from alcohol. He began to work hard to help his family and those around him. Now he and his wife serve the Lord together and most of their family has also joined the church, as they saw the change in Julien's life."

This Attorney Fights Rampant Abuse in Bolivia

T n Bolivia, 1 in 3 girls experience sexual abuse before L they turn 18, and 87% of women in Bolivia have experienced sexual violence from a family member. Bolivia has the highest rate of teen pregnancy in Latin America, and 20% of these pregnancies are estimated to be the result of rape. Because of social stigma, many sexual abuse victims never report their abuser.

Haggai leader and attorney Melissa N. Torrico Cáceres noticed something unsettling — despite the prevalence of sexual abuse in her country, it wasn't an issue churches seemed to be addressing. She decided to change that.

"I train parents, teachers, and church leaders to talk about preventing child sexual abuse at an early age," Melissa says. "Data shows children should be equipped with self-protection techniques between the ages of 3 and 5. We must arrive with the information before the abuser."

Melissa sees prevention of sexual abuse as her ministry. Pastors and other church leaders have told her she is an answer to their prayers.

Although Melissa's training program began in church contexts, it has expanded to secular organizations. Melissa has even been interviewed on secular radio about sexual abuse prevention, the broadcast reaching homes in Santa Cruz de la Sierra, Bolivia's largest city.

"But the most important achievement in my work and in my ministry is to have denounced a sexual abuser and put him in jail," Melissa says. "It was that day that God confirmed my call and prevented this person from abusing more children."

At the Haggai Leader Experience, Melissa realized there was room in her workshops for sharing the Good News. Before, she only provided information about sexual abuse prevention; she now includes a section about the Gospel.

"I have realized how blessed I am to be able to share my faith with freedom," she says. "I met so many other Haggai leaders from all over the world who have to hide to share their faith."

A Community-Oriented Outreach in Southeast Asia

"Wherever I go, I go to be a blessing. Wherever I stay, I stay to be fruitful." - Haggai leader Arianna* I n a mountainous country in Southeast Asia with only 1.7% of the population identifying as Christian, sharing the Gospel is a challenge. Haggai leader Arianna*, like most people she knows, was raised in a Buddhist home. She was taught from her parents to be a good person and to do good to others. Arianna states that she felt like there was still something more, and she was always looking for it but didn't even know what it was. In 2007, while at an English school, she met a team of missionaries who prayed for her and shared the Gospel. Two years later, she accepted Christ into her heart and got baptized. Arianna is still the only practicing Christian in her family and prays her family will come to know the Lord and serve Him as she does.

Preaching the Gospel and ministering to others comes with its own challenges and is still a new concept to local ministries and churches. This challenge leads Arianna's team to ever evolve in their ways of ministerial outreach. Currently, their focus has been on different discipleship avenues to minister to small group settings. People in Arianna's country are community-oriented, so these new avenues will be helpful in creating a deeper connection within the community.

It was after the Virtual Haggai Leader Experience (VHLE) in January this year, however, that Arianna came to understand her role in God's Kingdom. It shaped her understanding of His will in the world. After her equipping, and knowing she herself needed community just like her countrymen and women have recognized, she joined the national ministry in her country, as well as an organization that focuses on discipleship and church planting. In just a few months, they've already seen 85 people come to

- , Christ. Arianna set a goal to share the Gospel with 500 people after her VHLE, and she is encouraged by these new believers who are also going on to share the Gospel with others. She's seeing the Haggai model at work: leaders equipping leaders equipping leaders.
- In her full-time position, Arianna serves as the executive secretary and HR manager at a YMCA. It is there that she has had the opportunity of being involved with worship, teaching, and in coaching new believers. She says that she is always learning and seeking out new opportunities for growth in knowledge. It is very important for her to see that her people have biblical materials accessible to them in their heart language. As a country with several native languages, these resources can be difficult to acquire. It is through the help, support, and mission of the national YMCA and the connections that Arianna has that they are able to offer these resources. Arianna feels that it is her calling to be "a hand to help people who God puts in her life — to help them know, get closer to, and grow in the journey of the Lord." Her passion is to walk alongside people in their discipleship journeys.

Through Arianna's outreach, she hopes to share the Gospel with her parents every month and present the Good News to 500 people in the next two years. These goals were formed and ignited through her equipping, and her faith and trust in the Lord continues to give her strength in these endeavors.

Haggai leaders at work in their spheres of influence

- With a heart for global outreach, Arieston Gomes has an unyielding commitment to expanding the reach of the Gospel through his equipping, starting movements of Christian leaders throughout Brazil.
- 2. "The Haggai Leader Experience has profoundly influenced my life, affecting my family, friends, teammates, community, and the overall decisions I make," says a Haggai leader equipping churches in Gospel poor communities in Cambodia.
- 3. The sixth annual "Haggai Peru Challenge"

 designed to equip leaders to end Gospel
 poverty in Peru began with equipping 41
 indigenous leaders to bring the Gospel to the
 farthest reaches of the Peruvian Amazon.
- "My interest in winning children to Christ started with the Virtual Haggai Leader Experience," shares Marie, who helps youth in her country to foster firm foundations of faith.
- In Brazil, 87 outstanding Haggai leaders completed their HLE and are now serving their Gospel poor communities demonstrating and presenting the Good News broadly — through their equipping.

- 2. Rama is taking the Good News of Jesus to the most remote villages in India, equipping local leaders to reach those without access to the Gospel. God has worked in miraculous ways!
- 3. This Filipino Haggai leader serves as a pastor to expats, helping them navigate life abroad while sharing the Gospel message. His church is dedicated to meeting the legal and spiritual needs of this community.
- Mariana is utilizing her HLE in her nonprofit organization — helping survivors of human trafficking in Mexico find redemption and restoration in Jesus.
- 5. When wildfires devastated Maui in August, Haggai housed hundreds of relief workers and military personnel at our Mid-Pacific Center, which served as a hub for task forces providing aid and ministering to those on the front lines of the disaster.
- 6. The Global Advisory Council meeting brought together 151 Haggai leaders from 71 countries. They pledged to remain committed to God and fellow Haggai leaders and to live as effective witnesses for Christ in every sphere.


